Easter Egg Dyed Spuds

Ingredients/Equipment

Spudshed Baby Spuds 1kg

Queen Food Colouring

Paper Towels

Paint Brushes

Disposable Gloves

Method

Step 1

Ensure your baby spuds are clean & dry.

Step 2

Prepare your surface. Cover your crafting area with either newspaper, paper towels or plastic wrap. Ensure you're wearing disposable gloves, old clothes or an apron, and that you're working on a surface that's covered to avoid any staining.

Step 3

Lay your spuds out on paper towels, and gather your food colouring and paint brushes.

Step 4

Squeeze a drop or two of food colouring onto your spud.

Step 5

Take a paintbrush and paint the food colouring all over the spud, letting it dry on the paper towel.

Step 6

Allow the spuds to dry for several hours or overnight, before displaying them on your table, windowsill or in your chosen Easter basket.

Step 7

Once your painted spuds are dry, you can add some finishing touches by sprinkling them with glitter or other fun decorations. You could also draw on each spud!

Tip: Mix different combinations of the food colouring together to create new colours for the spuds!
